Advanced Roadside Impaired Driving Enforcement Program

The purpose of this 16-hour course is increase officer ability to observe, identify, and articulate the signs of impairment related to drugs, alcohol, or a combination of both. It also stresses the importance of securing the most appropriate biological sample in order to identify substances likely causing impairment. Students must have taken the Standardized Field Sobriety Testing (SFST) Practitioner training in order to attend this course. The Advanced Roadside Impaired Driving Enforcement (ARIDE) program includes the SFST refresher class and requires students to perform a successful demonstration of horizontal gaze nystagmus, walk and turn, and one leg stand at the conclusion of the refresher segment. Students unable to correctly demonstrate proficiency will not be able to continue with the training. Students are strongly encouraged to review the SFST procedure prior to the class.

Demand for ARIDE training is high. Once registered for the class, failure to attend without notification may impact enrollment for students and their agencies in future ARIDE training opportunities. Vacancies will be filled on a first-come, first-served basis. If there is a last-minute emergency, another SFST certified student may be substituted.
